

Great Programs Coming Our Way!!!

February: Our speaker will be Virginia Robertson. Her lecture is titled "If Monet Were A Quilter". She will be doing a color class on Monday, Feb. 12 at the Yavapai Hills Clubhouse, at 1 pm, following the regular meeting. She will be doing a New York Beauty/Pickle Dish workshop on Tuesday, Feb. 13, at the Yavapai Hills Clubhouse; set up will begin at 8:30 am.

March: Janet Carruth from Phoenix will do a power point lecture/trunk show on Penny Rugs. She will teach a half-day class on Monday, Mar. 12, at 1 pm, at the Yavapai Hills Clubhouse, following the regular meeting. The pattern will be a basket of apples. Janet will supply all the materials to complete this project for a kit fee of \$30.

April: Shelley Swanland will be doing a trunk show of approximately 40 quilts that represent work done over the last eight years. She has developed a technique for constructing Cathedral Window quilts using layered piecing techniques and featuring rolled bias curves. She states that although her patterns look intricate and complex, they are really fast and easy to construct. Her workshop will be on Tuesday, Apr. 10, at the Yavapai Hills Clubhouse; set-up will begin at 8:30 am. The workshop will be a combination of her patterns Berries Jubilee and Parchment & Black Lacquer Table Runner. She will also have her patterns for sale at the meeting and at the workshop.

VIRGINIA ROBERTSON

February 12, 2007 Lecture: If Monet Were A Quilter: A Trunk Show. This trunk show is an entertaining view of the quilts and fabric designs of textile artist Virginia Robertson. Monet's painting are used as a metaphor to show how color changes a quilt design. There are several versions of each quilt that show how much color changes the feel of a project. Interspersed with the quilts are studio shots and stories about the designing of quilting fabrics.

PICKLE DISH, NEW YORK BEAUTY OR WEDDING RING

February 13, 2007 Workshop Tuesday: \$30.00 per person: Set up from 8:30 A.M Class starts promptly at 9:15 A.M. to 3:30PM.

Take your pick, this is Virginia's most popular class. She has even taught it in Spain, in Spanish! Use Virginia's new acrylic cutting templates, see through foundation papers and choose your favorite design after the demo. Sew from the back or the front, it doesn't matter which way you learned to paper piece, you will be able to use Virginia's new foundation papers. There is no guess work. This is a different, easier method from all the other techniques.

Virginia will demonstrate the different quilts and talk about color. Then the rest of the day will be spent sewing the quilt of your choice. Select from the Perfect Pickle Dish, the Mini Pickle Dish, the Broken Pickle Dish, Wedding Ring, Mini Wedding Ring or a New York Beauty style quilt. Materials Fee: Cost of pattern:
