February's program is the Dutch Quilter, Lennie Honcoop, whose lecture is titled, "Out of Your Comfort Zone." Her workshop, no sew applique ,is full. Please let Chris know which flower pattern you want to make if you signed up, so we can notify Lennie in time to have the pattern of your choice available . Complete kits and many other patterns will be available at that time.

Oh my, can you believe the beautiful samples we received from Lennie Honcoop, the "Dutch Quilter"..we waited a long time for those samples, and it was worth it!!.. There

will be a \$7.50 pattern fee that will be collected by Lennie the day of the class. She will also have the ribbon tape for purchase to go with your flower design. If you wish to get your own ribbon in advance check out

At the class, Lennie will have complete kits available for all her flower designs ranging from \$39-to \$89..

To learn this technique you will be using your own fabric..and the pattern you have chosen.

Here is the supply list for Lennie Honcoop's workshop in February:

1. Pattern available for purchase from Lennie for \$7.50.

2. mini iron, and regular iron

3. small sharp scissors as well as fabric scissors.

4. steam-a-seam 2

5. sharpie pen

6. pressing sheet or mat

7. Ironing mat for your work station

8. 3/4 yard background fabric

9. 2 fat quarters of differnt shades of green for the leaves

10. several fat quarters of shades of flowers that you chose.

11. A good spirit and a smile
