



Wanda from Quilt & Sew House in Yuma will be selling her fabrics at Hope Lutheran Church's Fellowship Hall, at the corner of Road 2 North and Road 1 East in Chino Valley on February 12th, from 11am to 1pm. The church is easy to find: go north on Hwy 89 to Chino Valley and turn right at Safeway and go one block east. The church will be on your left at the corner of the first cross street.

If you have something to sell, the cost is \$10 a month, with a 3 month limit. If you're looking for something, there's no charge but there is a 3 month limit.
