

Thumb Butte Quilters Upcoming Programs

July: Thumb Butte's Annual Birthday Party. This year it will be a Hawaiian Luau – so get out those grass skirts and mu-mu's and bring your Hawaiian quilts, table runners, wall hangings or whatever you have to share. We'll be serving pu-pu's (appetizers) and there will be lots of door prizes! Be sure to come and join in the fun!

August: Kendra Maclean from Phoenix will be doing a lecture and trunk show on small quilts.

September: Mary Stori will do a lecture at our meeting and a half day workshop on Monday, September 10, after our meeting, on hand quilting and a full day workshop on Tuesday, September 11, which will be "Beading Basics and Beyond".

October: Patty Krause, from The Quilters Store in Sedona, will do a lecture and trunk show on collages at our meeting, and a half day workshop on Monday, October 8, and a full day workshop on Tuesday, October 9. You will need to participate in both workshops for this class. Monday's class will be choosing fabrics and cutting out patterns and Tuesday's class will be the actual construction of the collage.

Patty's description of the lecture is as follows: "Free yourself of rulers and pointed triangles. Learn how to design a quilt around a motif, create scenes or simply play with color. Let your collages reflect your humor, fantasies or dreams. The rules are few; the experience is self-directed. As a side benefit, your free-motion quilting will improve overnight with this technique.

The creative concepts incorporate Patty's experiences working with paper collage as a career counselor and with fabric collages as a quilter. The collage technique present is adapted from Rosemary Eichorn's book, The Art of Fabric Collage."

November: Our own Susan Smith will present a program on color and fabric selection.

December: Our annual Holiday Party.

January: The P.I.G. (Project in a Grocery Bag) challenge quilts are due this month. Bring your "finished" project or you'll have to make a community quilt to donate.

February: Lennie Honcoop, "The Dutch Quilter", has a technique featuring "easy no-sew appliqué". She creates appliqué pieces with Steam-a-Seam2 and finishes the edges with Hot Ribbon.

March: Sharyn Craig will be here to do a lecture, trunk show and workshop. Details will be forthcoming.

TBQ's July 9th Birthday Party is a celebration to us and about us. We ask please that no guests attend this private party... Thanks from the Luau Planning Committee.

FRIENDSHIP GROUPS submitted by Pam Jones and Susan Smith

This month we are highlighting two groups: Designing Women and Gad-Abouts.

DESIGNING WOMEN: The mission statement for this friendship group is: "to share techniques and contribute new ideas, encourage each other in the pursuit of quilts and garment design, share wisdom and experience and complete an individual yearly challenge decided upon by the group." Two years ago their challenge was "What is Victoria's Secret?". This year it is "Epiphany". Next year it is "It all started with...". Each member's project has to focus around the theme. These challenges are especially useful in broadening the perspective and desire of the group. Their focus this year has been on garments and designing art quilts. They meet in one of their ten homes on the third Tuesday of each month from 1-4pm. At that particular home, the hostess is responsible for dessert as well as presenting a demonstration and informational session centered on a group interest such as tassels or color design. If you were privileged enough to attend the TBQ quilt show in June, you would then agree how gifted and talented this group is and how exciting it was to see their offerings to the show.

GAD-ABOUTS: Since their first meeting in 1998, these ten ladies have been very good friends. They help each other out in life as well as in quilting. Their focus is self-directed. TBQ is on the *MOVE*..

As announced in June, TBQ will move meeting locations--but not until AUGUST! In July, we will meet at St. Luke's Episcopal Church for the last time.

Watch for directions and a map in the August News for our NEW meeting location. We're not going to give that information to you now...we don't want you going to the wrong place!

Here is the history of TBQ's meeting locations, as was shared with you at the June meeting:

The very first meeting was at Tren Conner's house. It was the "organizational meeting" where plans were made to go forward with a new quilting guild.

The "founding mothers" decided to host a "tea" for Quilters at the Methodist Church on Gurley. That was August 14, 1995. On that day, Thumb Butte Quilters was born!

TBQ met at the Methodist Church for the first couple of years, then Judy DeVault moved the Guild to the Christian Church on Senator Highway in 1998. That location worked for five years.

Then in 2003, Jean Ehlers moved us to St. Luke's Episcopal Church, where we've been very happy.

But, as much as we want it to...nothing ever stays the same. Meeting site changes take place because of space needs, and because of compatibility with church administration and their needs. We feel that it is again time for a change in TBQ's meeting location.

You all know it's not easy to find an affordable meeting place for a group of our size here in the Prescott area. Your Executive Committee has selected the American Evangelical Lutheran Church as the next meeting site for TBQ. This change will be effective August 13th.

So what are the "pluses" of the new meeting location?

The chairs have been "seat-tested" ...and they are much improved over the ones we currently use.

There is a stage in the meeting room where leaders, speakers, and Show & Tell will be more visible.

Leaders and monthly hostesses will NOT be involved in room set-up and take-down. The room will be set up for us--just the way we want it, and we'll still be able to have our special tables for Membership Sign-In, Hospitality, Company Store, Birthday Raffle, Workshops, and Mentors.

The Executive Committee suffered some anxious moments as we were making this decision. What will the membership think? Will they accept this change? Please know that we did the best we could and in the best interest of the Guild. We hope you will accept this change. We know you will soon adjust to it and enjoy it! And life will be good again! :-)


