Quilt Show Dates: Friday and Saturday, June 3 and 4, 2011

Quilt Show Set-Up Date: Thursday, June 2

Quilt Show Location: Prescott High School, 1050 N. Ruth Street, Prescott, AZ 86301

Quilt Show Theme: "Prescott Loves Quilting!"

Oh My Gosh! THIS IS IT!!!! This is the last TBQ Newsletter before it's Quilt SHOW TIME!!! Woo hoo!! The Party starts very soon. Are you ready? Have you met your <u>Quilt Show High-Five Promise</u>? Are you planning to <u>enter a MINIMUM of TWO quilts</u>? Here's hoping you have your quilt entry forms filled out and on their way to Kathleen Bond. The deadline is May 1st.

I repeat...completed Quilt Entry forms (with pictures) are due to Kathleen by May 1st. If you are tardy, CALL HER right now! Karla Morriston, who is handling Quilt Check-In, needs to hand out to you the quilt check-in bags and information at the May 9th TBQ meeting. You'll need this information in order to take your quilt entries to the Quilt Show on Set-Up Day (June 2).

Quilts for Vignettes must follow the same rules. Having every single quilt officially entered and documented for the Quilt Show will help the many workers keep track. The last thing we want to do is lose a quilt. And if you've ever been at Quilt Check-In and Check-Out...you'll know that it can get a little hectic!

Sign-up, sign-up, and sign-up again!!! Volunteer Sign-Up posters were available at the April TBQ meeting. They will be available again at the May meeting. When you signed up in April, you were given a Sign-Up Reminder Sheet. Do you know where that sheet is now? Get it right now and make this change. Line 2 should say: TBQ Quilt Show Work Dates: June 2-4, 2011. Mark every calendar in your house: **TBQ Quilt Show Work Dates**, **June 2-4**, **2011**. If you missed the April TBQ meeting and will also miss the May TBQ meeting, call Susan Smith to volunteer for a two-hour work shift--preferably both Quilt Show days as well as Set-Up day!

Let's face it. Our Quilt Show is a lot of work, but if everyone is there, helping, it will seem more like a PARTY!!

<u>Have you e-mailed 30 friends</u> yet about the Quilt Show? Hey...it's now or never! What are you waiting for?! And the bookmarks are easy to hand out! We started with 10,000 bookmarks. If half of that number come to our Quilt Show, we will all be on Quilter's Cloud 9!!!

OK, the next topic of discussion is the <u>face blocks</u>. Have you created your self portrait yet? They are soooo much fun! They are due at the May 9th TBQ meeting. Be sure to sign them, and turn them in to Susan Smith or Shirley Pichoff. They are being used to create a Quilters Wall of Fame along the Quilt Show entrance. They will be kept with the Quilt Show supplies in our storage facility and will be used at all future Quilt Shows.

Now take a moment... Create a picture in your mind of a fabulous array of quilts, a thousand foot row of quilt vendors and a twirling merry-go-round of Quilt Show spectators. What a gala quilting party it will be. Come, join the celebration!!

The seven Vignettes that will grace our Quilt Show space this year have the following themes: **Prescott Loves** <u>Holidays</u>, <u>The Old West</u>, <u>The Arts</u>, <u>Antiques</u>, <u>Gardens</u>, <u>Home and Family</u>, and <u>The Great</u> <u>Outdoors</u>.

Here's hoping you've looked at every quilt in your house to see if it will fit into any of the themes. Joanne Storer is having nightmares that she won't have enough flower quilts for her Gardens Vignette. Let's show her--we've got flowers!! The goal is to have at least 20 quilts for each Vignette. That's almost half of the number of quilts stated on our advertising. We've publicized that we will have over 300 Quilts on display. The quilts for Vignettes are the easy ones--they're the ones that are already done and have been hanging on our quilt racks for a couple of years. (The hard ones are the ones we're still stitching like crazy ladies in order to get them done by Show time!) All quilts for Vignettes need to have a picture and the Quilt Entry form completed. They must go through the same check-in, check-out process as new quilts. However, for quilts in Vignettes, you do not need to fill in the "Short Description" section on the form. So that saves you time right there!

Take the above list of Vignette themes and cruise your house looking for 'site decor', props, cute stuff that could be used in any of the Vignettes to enhance the look and charm of the Vignettes! If you find something that would be just perfect, call the Vignette Designer or call Carolyn Edwards.

Vignette Designer Roni Barron volunteered way back in October, when her Vignette theme was 'Prescott Is the Christmas City'. And then when the Vignette theme became 'Prescott Loves The Holidays', she was wrangled into retaining her Designer position. So she's asking for some help. TBQ's Sharlot Hall Quilters loaded a new quilt into the hand quilting frame at Sharlot Hall on September 30th, and the quilting has begun!




