October Program

At the October 9 meeting we will have Phyllis Miller as our guest lecturer. Phyllis is a national author, lecturer and teacher. She has been quilting since 1968 and has won many awards for her quilting and appliqué. She will be judging guilts – we presently have 13 to be judged. This should be very interesting and informative, as we learn what judges look for and how they determine a "winning" guilt. After the meeting, at the Yavapai Hills Clubhouse, she will teach a half-day class on "Trapunto". There is still room in this class for anyone who is interested in learning this technique. The fee is \$15. On Tuesday, October 10, Phyllis will be teaching an all day class on 3-D Flowers (13 in all). This class is also being held at the Yavapai Hills Clubhouse and there is also room available in this class. The class fee is \$30. If you are interested in signing up for either class, please contact Chris Anders for payment and supply lists.

November guest lecturer and acclaimed quilter Lyn Mann will grace us with her extensive quilting knowledge during the November guild meeting. The title of her guild lecture will be " Slick Tricks". Her workshop will be the following day from 9am till 3pm and is called "Mad for Plaid".

Saturday, October 28th, the Quail Country Quilters guild in Cottonwood is

holding their fall boutique. There will be many items to choose from and an

opportunity to do some early Christmas shopping. It will take place at 820
