

APRIL 13 is the deadline to have your "20 Something..." Challenge done. We'll have a Viewer's Choice vote at that meeting. Even if you don't have your challenge project done by that day, you will need to have your Quilt Show Entry form completed. Here's how you do it: Under Category, check X mini-group or challenge to be hung with...and write in "20 Something..." As these quilt entries will be pinned to the hanging drape, you do not need to add a sleeve if you do not want to. The Quilt Entry Form is available on the TBQ website. AND the Quilt Entry Form needs a photo of your project. I will have a few Quilt Entry Forms with me on March 9. Let me know if you need one.

March Program



Barbara was born in Boise, Idaho and moved to Washington in her early twenties. She made clothing during her school years, and then explored other areas of artistic interest, including embroildery, photography,

and stained glass. Since learning to quilt in 1993, she has focused exclusively on fiber art.

Initially Barbara created many traditionally-styled quilts. As her skills grew, so did her confidence in her ability to create unique, non-traditional designs. Today she enjoys the challenge of integrating the quilting line and making it an important part of the overall design of a piece. She also works to create two-sided quilts where the back is a reflection of the front and offers the viewer a different perspective of the same piece.

Barbara is an award winning quilter having won Best of Show in the first juried quilt show she ever entered. Her work is in many private collections and has appeared at a number of shows and locations.

In 2005 Barbara retired from Clark College, located in Vancouver, Washington, where she taught computer software application classes for almost 20 years. She now focuses full-time on creating fiber art and teaching others the joy of quiltmaking. She lives with her family in Washougal, Washington.

March Workshop

March 9th - 1:00 to 4:00 pm Afternoon Workshop

Thread Painting: Butterflies from



Description: Long considered a symbol of transformation,

the butterfly is a common theme in Barbara's quilting. This workshop focuses on one of her favorite quilting stitches she calls "Pebbles".

Barbara will discuss using the right type of thread to add depth and dimension to your fiber art pieces. Topics to

be covered include what thread to use and when, the order of quilting, using a hoop, outlining, machine needles, and transferring images to fabric. We will also discuss how to make the piece two-sided.

March 10 Full day Workshop 9:00 am to 4:00 pm

Thread Painting: Japanese Maple



Description: The Japanese Maple signifies great blessings and a peaceful retreat. Create your own peaceful Japanese Maple by stitching leaves in the colors and quantify you prefer, and improve your quilting skills at the same time. This workshop is intended for the quilter who is reasonably comfortable with their machine quilting skills, but would like to learn tips and techniques for improvement. Students will practice a number of stitches that Barbara uses all the time to add depth and dimension to her fiber art pieces. She will also discuss thread in detail, the order of quilting, using a hoop, outlining, sewing machine needles, and transferring images to fabric. Barbara will also discuss how to make the piece two-sided.

February Program



Linda Poole came to us from her "frozen tundra" in her own words, aka Eastern Ohio. Besides 2 huge full suitcases filled to the brim with amazing quilts, she brought us an enlightening lecture on Turkish Tiles, and how these

century old traditional designs have not

only influenced local quilters, but her own work. It was fascinating to see that oriental patterns can be integrated in traditional quilting. Linda's workshop on cloth painting was enjoyed by all who attended and



generated lots of enthusiasm. All workshop participants went home with a completed project.

Laying out a quilt top over the mess doesn't count as spring cleaning.


