



March Program



Kim Shrader Fauth

Kim has been teaching quilt classes for approximately 10 years, but has been quilting for over thirty years. A former math teacher, she is an expert at explaining material so it makes sense. When she came up with the new ABCD Technique, she shared it with her Monday quilting group. They strongly encouraged her to write a book because the technique was so new and different. Her teaching background is evident throughout her book. The directions are in white, gray and black, with areas of emphasis in blue. Each step is broken down with accurate drawings and hints to make sewing easier. Even though there are only three steps, she has a review page after Step Two so you don't ruin all your gorgeous fabric! (Yes, we have all done those patterns with six steps to discover at step five something isn't You also will see her fun personality right....) throughout the pages and when she is teaching.

Kim is a native of Illinois, but has lived in Colorado and Idaho. She resides in Yuma, Arizona near the Mexico/California border. She is married to Daniel Fauth and has two children, Tyler and Leah. When she isn't teaching quilting, she is tutoring kids in math and traveling as much as possible.

April Workshop



Kim Fauth, from ABCD Quilting, will teach us her technique on ABCD Quilting. It has directions for making the 32 ABCD Blocks that are used in the design process. The blocks are made in three

steps by sewing on the diagonal and the sides in a specific order. No paper piecing, special rulers or templates are needed. An infinity of quilts can be generated.

March Program



We received the visit of another talented quilt artist, Barbara Shapel! She showed us her amazing double-sided quilts, which are almost exclusively thread painted. Barbara shared with us her vast knowledge about thread painting techniques, and everything about needles and threads. One thing she mentioned: it took her four years to develop her quilting mastery. Practice, practice and practice more!! As I had seen Barbara's video (from TBQ library), it felt that she was an old friend.

Personally, I learned a lot. I hope you did too! Thank you all for participating!

<u>2015 TBQ</u> Show Boutique Shoppe

Remember:

Boutique sales forms are due at the May guild meeting. No forms will be accepted after that. You will need to check in your items on Thursday, May 28th, at the check-in time for quilts. Items need to be brought back to the boutique site at the show.

Pricing items is not something the co-chairs can do for you. Try to decide the lowest price you would accept for your items, and go with it, if you're serious about selling. You will be able change your item price at any time, but you will need to come to the booth and sign a special price change form. No one else can do this for you. Keep in mind that lowering the price may mean you've missed a large part of the buyer's market.

You will need to pick up your unsold items Saturday at 5 pm. The staff cannot be responsible for returning them to you. If you cannot be there for pick-up, arrange to have someone do it for you and let us know at check-in time. We will need you to sign that designated person's name.

If you are donating a quilt for the Guild, please decide an appropriate price for the item.

Each participant will need to place their own price tags on the goods. You'll need to include an item description, your price, I.D. number (we'll assign that to you), and your name. The commission for the creators is 85% (an excellent rate) and 15% for the Guild with the Guild paying the tax.

We are limiting sales to items that are pieced, appliquéd, and quilted.


