

2015 TBQ Show Boutique Shoppe

Boutique info:

- 1) Sales forms for the Boutique Shop are due at our May meeting. No forms will be accepted after that.
- 2) If you decide you want to lower your original price, you can do so by coming to our booth and signing a form changing your price.
- 3) Please let your friends know that we will not be accepting credit cards. We will be taking cash or checks with ID only.
- 4) Use safety pins on your own price tags and have the tags in place at check in. Include:

- 5) Pick-up time for your unsold items will be the same as your show quilts pick-up time, Saturday afternoon. If you can not pick them up let us know who you have designated to do so. We can not be responsible for unclaimed items.
- 6) The commission on your sold items will be 85%, with 15% going to the guild. The money will be dispensed to you by check at a guild meeting, possibly as soon as June.

At the May meeting we will provide bags for the sellers to put their sales articles in. The sellers should put a copy of the list of the items to be sold stapled to their bag. The unsold things will be placed in the bag at the end of the show to be picked up by the seller.

Also donated is a big tub of shirting fabric.


