At last: Silent Auction for UFO's is coming!!!

Again, thank you to all of you who have donated quilts at some stage of completion for our auction. There are an amazing 36 quilts to go up for grabs!!

To whet your appetite, there is a detailed list of each quilt with measurements and what comes in the package <u>(click here for list)</u>, together with pictures<u>(click here for pictures</u>). Each picture is numbered to match the list.

The UFOs are priced in such a way that it would be a sin NOT to purchase them. There are a few lovely FULL kits available in the lot.

How does a Silent Auction work?

All quilts will be displayed on tables so that you have the opportunity to check what you are interested in. With each quilt, there is going to be a sheet for bidding, indicating the starting price and minimum increment.

Example:

UFO – SILENT AUCTION PLEDGE LIST – JULY 2014 Quilt Description: Pine Garland Size: 36" x 42"

Bidder's name (in printed letters)	Bid
	Minimum increment: \$0.50
Starting price:	\$5.00
Jane Smith *	\$ 5.00
Joan Johnson *	\$ 5.50
Tammy Vanderbilt *	\$ 8.00

*Made up names

Once the auction opening is announced, you can put your name and bid on the sheet next to the quilt(s) you like.

For quilts where the starting price is up to \$7.00, the minimum increment is \$0.50.

For quilts where the starting price is \$8.00 and above, the minimum increment is \$1.00.

You are welcome to bid more than the minimum increment, and to bid on several quilts.

<u>August Workshop</u>

Listen up, all you Bonnie Hunter fans! Gina Halladay, another scrap quilt queen, will be with us in August. She's the Threaded Pear Studio of Gilbert, AZ. Let's welcome her with open arms as she shares her Trunk Show extraordinaire! She's a designer, a quilt shop owner, and a long-armer. She will have lots to make us happy!

Gina will teach a half day class on Monday afternoon, August 11, after the Guild meeting. Cost is \$25.00. I will be taking sign-ups at the July Birthday Party meeting. Gina will be teaching Bonnie Hunter's "Scrappy Trip" pattern. This is a really fun quilt...and no matter what fabrics you choose, it will turn out great!

Supply List: Sewing machine, etc.; rotary cutter, mat, rulers, etc.; Jelly Rolls & fabric of your choice.

Since participants will be working with 12" blocks, rather than a set quilt pattern, they can make their finished quilt as large as they want. So the yardage needed will vary with their desired finished project.



To make one 12" scrappy trip block, you will need:

(6) 2.5" X 16" rectangles of varying contrasting colors including lights and darks. Don't worry about matching or color coordinating. EVERYTHING GOES in this quilt!

Note If you are cutting from FQ's...just cut from the 18" side of the FQ and leave them 18" long. It doesn't make sense to take the time to trim 2" off the end! You can use the leftovers in a scrappy pieced border if so desired.


The top quilt was made by Judy Larson. The bottom quilt was made by Barbara Merkel and is owned by Susan Perry.
