Rachel brought a wonderful selection of beautiful, vibrant coats and jackets she has created using several different piecing techniques. She kept our attention with her good humor, while inspiring us to mix many fabrics, colors and embellishments in our quilting. She also incorporates several different piecing techniques into her coats. She builds her piecing onto a muslin coat pattern and once it is complete, lines her coats with a fun variety of fabrics. Rachel encouraged everyone to come up after her presentation, try on any of her garments and also ask questions. She has a pattern line and brought several of her coat patterns for sale.

Rachel is full of energy and kept everyone who took her Seminole piecing class challenged with learning several different piecing techniques. She gave us step-by-step instructions and encouraged us to make the different samples for our reference later. She taught some more involved piecing techniques for the students who had taken her class before. We were able to purchase her booklet "Picture This Techniques" which gives very clear instructions with diagrams for her piecing techniques.

This seemed like a fairy tale, but with persistence and dedication the impossible was achieved. The pattern was selected, "Sunshine Rose Garden" designed by Kathy Nakajima from the Quilters Newsletter Cover Collection, copyright 2007. The fabric was purchased and the project was underway. The work manager was Carolyn Edwards. The color and fabric manager was Susan Smith. Paper Piecers for the nine 23" Mariner's Compass blocks were Chris Anders, Kathy Beeson and Lorraine Owen. Applique Manager was Barbara Merkel. Appliquers, working in the Pearl Pereira applique style, were Kathleen Bond, Maryann Conner, Carolyn Edwards, Jean Ehlers, Barbara Merkel, Carol Miller, Alice Obrenovich, Shirley Pichoff and Marilyn Thompson. Hand appliquers were Anne Abrams, Lynn Beck, Kathleen Bond, Rosemary Carr, Angie Christy, Carolyn Edwards, Jane Holland, Pat Hopgood, Shirl Kelliher, Jackie McDonald, Barbara Merkel, Carol Miller, Karla Morriston, Lorraine Owen, Shirlee Smith and Marilyn Thompson. And then the Work Manager cried in dismay, and Karla Morriston (the accountant) stepped up and said, "I'm used to meeting deadlines. We can do this." And she pushed with all her might, and the quilt TOP was finished at 3 p.m. the day before the Quilt Show set-up for Mountain Top Quilters Guild.


