September 12 lecture: "Any Picture into Thread on Any Machine"



Linda Merrifield has been passionate about free-motion embroidery for the past 39 years. She received her first instruction in 1977 after seeing it demonstrated at a

sewing show at the Los Angeles Convention Center. She was immediately hooked. She had been a garment seamstress for many years, yet loved the uniqueness this gave to her one-of-a kind garments. Over the years, Linda has taught her style of free-motion embroidery to many sewers. The best part is that any sewing machine can produce this wonderful technique. Your sewing machine only needs to have a darning or embroidery foot and be able to lower the feed dogs.

Linda won Best Jacket/Vest category and Honorable Mention for two other garments at the Road to California Quilt show in 2007. After many requests, she started selling her garments at a variety of shows in California and Arizona. She is still amazed at her success. In making her garments, she uses a wide variety of off-the-wall fabrics and hopes to inspire you to think outside the box when searching for that perfect piece of yardage and embellishment. Linda brings many years of sewing experience and enthusiasm to this unique presentation.

Karla was the strong, silent type. She came into our Quilt Guild lives about 2008/2009. We don't know why, when, or how she decided that she needed to quilt...or how it was that she came to us. How did she find TBQ? She was always active and available, except maybe not so much during tax time, when we knew to give her some space. Her first 'job' with TBQ was in the kitchen, on the Refreshments committee--kind of a "behind the scenes" job. With her Accountant capabilities, she audited TBQ's books every year since she joined us. She was also a MAJOR contributor to TBQ

finally becoming a 501(c)3 organization. And then in 2015, she and Kathy Beeson were Quilt Show Co-Chairs, which resulted in a very, very successful Show. She was a regular stitcher with the hand quilters at Sharlot Hall. She was also a 'regular' in the monthly gathering of the mini-group "Scattered Threads" almost as soon as she joined TBQ. She was steady and consistent in her quilt making--working mainly on one thing at a time until it was done. Then she joined in with an applique mini-group called "Got App" and with the "Pedal Pushers" who are serious about making 100 year old vintage sewing machines work again! Her last contribution to TBQ was to push and push with all her might to get the Appliquers working on the TBQ 2017 Opportunity Quilt to get it done on time--which we did, thanks to Karla! Oh my...dear, dear Karla. We're going to miss you...but our hearts are full of love and delight that you were in our lives...for at least a little while. Until we meet again, dear Karla...

Community Service



It's time to get "Handmade Hugs" (our Community Service Project) started! We will be meeting on the 4th Monday of every month at St. Luke's.

Our first meeting was on Monday, August 22. The church has generously provided their classroom for our use. The classroom is located next to our meeting room. If you park on the left (south) side of the church, you can enter the door located there for easy access to the classroom. We start at 9 a.m. Bring your lunch or, if you'd rather eat out, the Antelope Hills Golf Course is nearby and has a restaurant available.

We will be making quilts and pillowcases for foster children ages birth to 18. You can bring a project to work on or participate in a group project. For those who cannot bring a sewing machine, there will be plenty of other tasks to work on; i.e., cutting, sorting, ironing, etc.

Since our guild's purpose is to <u>"advance the art and appreciation of quilting through education,"</u> this will be a wonderful opportunity to teach various techniques to those who are new to quilting and for those who want to try something they haven't done before. This month we will be working on strip piecing. If you'd like to get a head start on the project, gather your scraps and cut them into strips measuring no less than 1" and no more than 2". Any size in between is good and length doesn't matter—we'll use them all. I have a donated bolt of muslin to use as foundation and donated fabric that is ready to be cut!

Other supplies you might want to bring:

Cutting mat Rotary Cutter Ruler Glue Stick If you would like to make a pillowcase, you will need a 10" x 41" piece of fabric for the band and a 26 ½" x 41" rectangle for the body. This is also a great opportunity for us to participate in the American Patchwork & Quilting challenge of donating one million pillowcases to local charities!

For those of you who prefer to work on your projects at home, we look forward to seeing your quilts and pillowcases at our meetings where they will be shown in our special show and tell.

Looking forward to working with you on this great project. Thank you for your support and your "Handmade Hugs."
