


Lots of classes are coming your way so check the list below to see what you'd like to learn. I know the economy hasn't helped so you may need to be more choosy but perhaps that one class you attend will fill you with ideas for some time to come.

April 2011 - Susan Cleveland will be doing a 1/2 day workshop on Monday: Bold Needle Threads

Impact with big decorative threads stitched through the needle can be easily achieved! Learn how to adjust your machine, choose needles, and select stitch patterns to get stunning results with these threads. After class you'll have the ability to decorate fabric and quilt quilts with a new array of beautiful threads. At home students may create bookmarks with their decorated strips. Kits of fabric, stabilizer, fusible and threads may be purchased in class for \$18.





And a full day class on Tuesday: **Piping Hot Binding**

Piped bindings add spark and a professional finish to any style piece. Every detail of binding and tiny, perfect piping will be covered in class with step-by-step demos and printed instructions. Machine differences will be addressed so students will be successful with their own machines. Students work on their practice piece to achieve making perfect piping, preparing the quilt, applying binding, mitering corners, joining tails, and finishing for a show-quality back. Variations will be on display and discussed. Many major award-winners are using this technique to achieve stunning results!

May 2011 - Cindy Brick will be doing a one and a half day workshop called: Color, Fabric & Embellishments for Crazies

Give your Crazy quilts that professional look with the tricks and tips you'll pick up from this learn-as-you work class, from the right fabrics and colors to adding that final touch of embroidery orbeading. We'll explore both

modern quick-pieced and traditional methods, and examine a variety of modern and vintage Crazies. You'll take home a pillow ormini-wall quilt as a memory of the class! Full day session. (half-day sessions available for Color, Fabrics, or Embellishments. Includes general crazy quiltmaking techniques)

Quilt Show Theme: "Prescott Loves Quilting!"

Two more months, and then it's Show Time! How are you doing on your "<u>Quilt Show High-Five Promise</u>"? Rest assured that we're all scrambling to get our Quilt Show Entries finished. (Remember, please show your stuff with a <u>MINIMUM of TWO quilt entries</u>.) Quilt entry forms can be found on this website. You'll need to attach a picture of your quilt. (TBQ Photographer Shirlee Smith can help you with a photo if necessary.) Please plan to enter a few of your earlier quilts in the Vignettes? (Vignette quilts may have been hung in area Quilt Shows prior to this year's Show. The only job a Vignette quilt has is to look stunning within the theme of a Vignette.) NOTE: For Vignette quilts, you may omit filling in the "Short Description" section of the Quilt Entry Form. Also, Vignette quilts don't necessarily require a sleeve, as they may be draped or folded within the Vignette display, and may not be displayed in full. COMPLETED QUILT ENTRY FORMS ARE DUE TO KATHLEEN BOND BY MAY 1st.

Email 30 friends about the Quilt Show. This is e-a-s-y!!! "Copy and paste" the top 4 lines of this "Quilt Show News", add a note that you'll see them at the Show, and you're done! OR, get 30 TBQ Quilt Show bookmarks from Sandy Holderness and pass them out to your Sundy School group, your book club, or your sorority sisters. Do either of these options, or half and half, and you can check this off your Quilt Show High Five Promise list!

Has your mini-group planned a workday to <u>create your self portraits</u> yet? Hopefully, you all have picked up your 12.5" x 12.5" square of muslin from Shirley Pichoff. If not, you still have time. These self portraits are to be signed, should kinda look like you, and do not have to be quilted. Have fun with it! Didn't you love Sandy McGarry's playful self portrait!! Woo hoo! Turn in your "YOU" muslin square to Shirley Pichoff soon, if not sooner!
