BREAKING NEWS:

Completed Quilt Registration forms are due at the April 13th TBQ meeting! Will any of your quilts fit into any of the seven Vignette themes listed below? Remember that guilts displayed in Vignettes may have hung in any guilt show in the area in the past. Quilts in Vignettes will NOT be included in the 'Viewer's Choice' voting. They'll just be displayed to enhance the theme of the Quilt Show. TBQ is known for its Vignettes--let's not disappoint the viewing public!! There can't be too many quilts?! Let's show 'em that Prescott's Gone Quiltin'!
