# ♥ Workshop News

February 2011 - Mary Lou Weidman.

**Day 1 - 3 hr class:** This workshop introduces new friends to the technique called "Hoochy Mama" which uses 4" strips of fabric to make wonderful traditional blocks wonky and fun. These blocks can make any everyday block into something interesting, exciting and fun and even better, once you get the hang of this technique and style, you can make a quilt in much less time. For baby quilts, hangings and gifts ♥ this is the perfect class. Come prepared to learn about color, value and a new way to make fabulous, funky blocks. Smiling and laughter is a part of this experience too.



**Day 2 - 6 hr class:** This class is for those students who know how to do the Hoochy Mama blocks or who have taken classes before and want to stretch even farther. We will be exploring "things" made of Hoochy Mama blocks, wild wild geese, flowers, cats and hats and more. This is for students to who want to get out of the box even farther...maybe even jumping high out of that box. If you want to stretch your creativity, this class is for YOU.



**March - Wilma Hitterman** is a specialist in featherweight and treadle sewing machines. She will provide a lecture in the art of the treadle machine and quilting with this machine.

She comes from Payson and has a passionate interest in preserving these machines and the art of treadle machine quilting. She helped develop a separate judging category at the Rim Country Quilt Show for treadle machine quilting. Even if you do not have a treadle I believe you will find her knowledge of these machines fascinating. She will bring several machine heads and share the history of the treadle as well.

**April - Susan Cleveland** 's enthusiasm for quilting is said to be contagious! Students enjoy her upbeat attitude, well-written instructions, and one-on-one attention included in every workshop. Her quilts have been shown in international-level competitions since 1997 and have received many awards. Judges comment on her fine workmanship and appreciate her original style. She bases her designs on traditional patterns then adds specialty threads, prairie points, piping, and great binding techniques. Susan is inventor of the Groovin' Piping Trimming Tool which is used to trim piping seam allowances and inventor of the Prairie Pointer pressing tool. She is proud to have been named 2010 Minnesota Quilter of the Year!

Materials to donate: Embellishments (for small embellishment bags with lace, beads, yarn, buttons that will be sold at the show), polyfill (to stuff DD dolls and anything else we come up with) and Bali pop remnants.

## Vignettes

"What is a Vignette?", you ask. It's a small, room-size area set up within the Quilt Show space with a designated theme to accent the Quilt Show theme! What is the Quilt Show theme? "Prescott Loves Quilting!" TBQ has a reputation for enhancing its Quilt Show with "those cute little Vignettes scattered throughout the Show". We've done it for every Quilt Show to date...and we're going to do it again!
