March Program

Wilma Hitterman is a specialist in featherweight and treadle sewing machines. She will provide a lecture in the art of the treadle machine and quilting with this machine.

She comes from Payson and has a passionate interest in preserving these machines and the art of treadle machine quilting. She helped develop a separate judging category at the Rim Country Quilt Show for treadle machine quilting. Even if you do not have a treadle I believe you will find her knowledge of these machines fascinating. She will bring several machine heads and share the history of the treadle as well.

Workshop News

Lots of classes are coming your way so check the list below to see what you'd like to learn. I know the economy hasn't helped so you may need to be more choosy but perhaps that one class you attend will fill you with ideas for some time to come.

April 2011 - Susan Cleveland will be doing a 1/2 day workshop on Monday:

Bold Needle Threads

Impact with big decorative threads stitched through the needle can be easily achieved! Learn how to adjust your machine, choose needles, and select stitch patterns to get stunning results with these threads. After class you'll have the ability to decorate fabric and quilt quilts with a new array of beautiful threads. At home students may create bookmarks with their decorated strips. Kits of fabric, stabilizer, fusible and threads may be purchased in class for \$18.

And a full day class on Tuesday:

Piping Hot Binding

Piped bindings add spark and a professional finish to any style piece. Every detail of binding and tiny, perfect piping will be covered in class with step-by-step demos and printed instructions. Machine differences will be addressed so students will be successful with their own machines. Students work on their practice piece to achieve making perfect piping, preparing the quilt, applying binding, mitering corners, joining tails, and finishing for a show-quality back. Variations will be on display and discussed. Many major award-winners are using this technique to achieve stunning results!

May 2011 - Cindy Brick will be doing a one and a half day workshop called:

Color, Fabric & Embellishments for Crazies

Give your Crazy quilts that professional look with the tricks and tips you'll pick up from this learn-as-you work class, from the right fabrics and colors to adding that final touch of embroidery orbeading. We'll explore both modern quick-pieced and traditional methods, and examine a variety of modern and vintage Crazies. You'll take home a pillow ormini-wall quilt as a memory of the class! Full day session. (half-day sessions available for Color, Fabrics, or Embellishments. Includes general crazy quiltmaking techniques)

++++ We need you to enter a MINIMUM of TWO quilts in the Show. You'll find a link in this month's news so you can print off a Quilt Entry Form. Get your completed forms to Kathleen Bond by May 1st! The Quilt Entry Form requires a picture of your quilt. (If you don't have a picture of your quilt, bring your quilt to the March or April meetings and ask our very efficient TBQ Photographer, Shirlee Smith, to take one for you.) Be sure to read the Vignette news article this month. It includes suggestions about how you can enter FIVE or even TEN quilts in the Show. (Won't that look good when you tell your friends back home that you entered TEN quilts in YOUR Quilt Show this year!)

++ Email 30 friends about the Quilt Show. You can 'copy and paste' the above portion of this news report and send it to everyone in your address book! Or...pick up 30 bookmarks from Sandy Holderness, and snail-mail them to your friends! They look great on the refrigerator!! Sandy has oodles of bookmarks available--pick 'em up, carry 'em in your purse, and hand 'em out every chance you get!

++ Get "In Your Face"! We plan to do a Quilters Wall of Fame. Be sure we have YOUR mug shot! This is something new this year...and it will grow as the years go on. We want EVERY TBQ quilter to create a self portrait! If you did not already do so, get a 12.5" x 12.5" square of muslin from Shirley Pichoff. Create a self portrait using any method you choose: applique, fusible applique, snippets, thread play, glue, whatever! Make it fun! Write your name on the block in any manner you choose. Do not quilt the square. Do not 'finish' the square. (Reference: "Quilter's Yearbook" by Amy Bradley.) If you have questions about this project, call Shirley Pichoff. Turn your "YOU" block in to Shirley Pichoff the first chance you get...or ASAP! Get your mini-groups together to work on this project. Designate a specific day to cut and glue and sew and paste to make "YOU" blocks! You probably should have some wine and a designated driver!

<u>Prescott lovesThe Old West</u> - Designer: Catherine Ericsen (Quilts needed: cowboys, cowgirls, horses, cowboy boots, cowboy hats, Wyatt Earp, etc.)

<u>Prescott loves The Arts</u> - Designer: Eve Pelletier (Quilts needed: Contemporary, Thespian-themed, Theater-related, the Opera, Books, Sculpture, Art Gallery, etc.)

Prescott loves Antiques - Designers: Featherweights friendship group (Quilts needed: Antique quilts, of course!)

<u>Prescott loves Gardens</u> - Designer: Joanne Storer (Quilts needed: Floral quilts, Garden quilts, how about a little Sunbonnet Sue, etc.)

<u>Prescott loves Home and Family</u> - Designers: Appliquettes friendship group (Quilts needed: House quilts, school house quilts, children's quilts, nursery rhyme quilts, alphabet quilts, storybook quilts, etc.)

Vignette Designers will bring together 'stuff' (site decor) to give their Vignette theme 'definition' and 'atmosphere'!

Vignette Designers will set up their Vignettes on Quilt Show Set-Up Day--Thursday, June 2nd. Each Vignette

Designer will be given approximately 20 quilts to display within their Vignette space.

And for everyone else who is NOT a Vignette Designer...it's your job to print off the Quilt Entry form, and look at every quilt in your house to see if it will fit into one of the seven above listed Vignette themes. Quilts hung in Vignettes may have hung in any previous Quilt Show in the area in the past. Quilts hung in Vignettes will not necessarily be shown in-full. They may be folded or draped, and only partially visible. The job of a quilt on display in a Vignette is to look cute, or stunning, or smashing, or adorable--but not necessarily to be on display in full view.

Note to TBQ Past Presidents: There will NOT be a special display of Past Presidents' quilts this year...so get your President's quilt into a Vignette!

Completed Quilt Entry forms (with pictures) are due to Kathleen Bond by **May 1st**. Quilts hung in Vignettes must go through the same check-in and check-out process as new quilts! The last thing we want to do is misplace a quilt!!! (Is your 4 year old quilt any less valuable than the one you just finished? We think not!)

So that, dear TBQ'ers, is your assignment! Now get busy and get Quilt Entry forms filled out! And with all these Vignette opportunities, surely you can find at least FIVE quilts to enter in this year's Quilt Show It's going to be yet another G-R-E-A-T one!


