On November 14th, through January 9th, we'll hang a quilt show of "All That Glitters"...quilts that make your eyes wiggle when you look at them. If I have talked to you about hanging one of your quilts, I will be getting back to you to make specific quilt 'hand-off' arrangements. I could still use a couple more quilts. If you have made quilts in any of these pattern names (Crown of Thorns, Single Wedding Ring, Ocean Waves, Sharyn Craig's Northwind, even a Lone Star, or any other half-square triangles pattern), I would like to include your quilt! Hanging a quilt at the Adult Center will give you a "bust your buttons" high! Just come to the Adult Center when we're changing out the quilts, and you'll see what I'm talking about! And, by the way, you all are invited to attend a Quilt Hanging! Be there at 8 a.m. on Friday, November 14th! Pete and Trish from the City of Prescott Parks and Rec Department, along with Mary Andra Holmes and myself, can get those ten quilts changed in 28 minutes flat!!

On January 9th, we'll go with a potpourri theme, and we'll hang quilts by TBQ members who haven't had a chance to share a quilt before. Let me hear from you! ALSO, I'm open to any and all theme suggestions. How about all quilts red/white/black? Or blue and yellow quilts? Talk to me! Tell me what you'd like to see and share...

Quilt sizes needed are:

Large--from 60" to 90" wide, and any length. We need SIX.

Small--at least 45" wide, but no wider than 54". Any length. We need FOUR.

Quilt Show 2009

Jeri and I would now like to appeal to you to work on Quilts of Valor. These will be presented to local veterans at the show and even though we have sent out the call nationwide, local quilts would have special meaning. Consider making a QOV in addition to the community quilt you are working on. Or petition your mini group to build a few. Several of you asked me for the QOV guidelines, so here they are in a nutshell. Size: 50×60 minimum, 72×87 maximum, 54×67 ideal; good quality, 100% cotton fabric, preferably in patriotic colors; a label with name of quilt, name(s) of piecers and quilters, dedication, presented to ______, date, etc.; a pillow case for presentation; an optional journal highlighting the quilt's journey. Prescott's Gone Quiltin' - At the Library (library books/shelves, quilts made to go with books, quilts that tell a story)

Prescott's Gone Quiltin' - At the the Square (house quilts, houses around the square, quilts with squares)

Do these suggestions give you any ideas? Brainstorm with your best quilter pals! You can elaborate on any of the above ideas...or come up with a vignette theme of your own. When you agree to be a Vignette Designer, you will bring together site decor around that theme on Quilt show set-up day. You do not have to gather up all the quilts for your Vignette. TBQ members will enter quilts according to the Vignette themes. Quilts entered in a Vignette category may have hung in previous TBQ Quilt Shows. Please, please call me if you want to run with any of the above ideas! We just need a couple more of the vignettes to be claimed.

We need to have the Vignette names selected by November--that's THIS month!! The Quilt Show Entry forms need to be finalized, and will include Vignette categories. Join in the fun, 'cause *Prescott's Gone Quiltin'!*
