As the holidays are approaching we get **s-t-r-e-s-s-e-d** to the max! So I thought what better time to share a recipe I came across in a quilting forum [yes! Quilting forum]. I learned early in my years working in a pharmacy that the most stressful time of the month was around the first when lots of people received checks and wanted to do their shopping. My boss would go buy chocolate for the employees to help our endorphins deal with the level of stress. For those of you that don't know chocolate works on your brain the same way being in love does! [or so we are told] I know the sugar and white flour are not the best for you but if your private stash of chocolate has been raided by your hubby or other members of your family.....keep this recipe in a special location for "emergency's only"!!

Oh! What a thought! How about gift giving! Put the dry ingredients in a mug and wrap it with pretty cellophane, a bow or ribbon, and a copy of the recipe so your special friend can have something for her emergency moment!

### MINUTE CHOCOLATE MUG CAKE

- 1 Coffee Mug
- 4 tablespoons flour(that's plain flour, not self-rising)
- 4 tablespoons sugar
- 2 tablespoons baking cocoa
- 1 egg
- 3 tablespoons milk
- 3 tablespoons oil
- 3 tablespoons chocolate chips (optional)

Small splash of vanilla

\*\* You might want to add 1/4 tsp baking power or/and 1/4 tsp baking soda, a dash of salt\*\*

Add dry ingredients to mug, and mix well .. Add the egg and mix thoroughly. Pour in the milk and oil and mix well. Add the chocolate chips (if using) and vanilla, and mix again. Put your mug in the microwave and cook for 3 minutes at 1000 watts. The cake will rise over the top of the mug, but don't be alarmed! Allow to cool a little, and tip out onto a plate if desired. EAT! (This can serve 2 if you want to share!)

~~~And why is this the most dangerous cake recipe in the world? Because now we are all only 5 minutes away from chocolate cake at any time of the day or night!

If you are more into pineapple upside down cake maybe leave out the cocoa, put some pineapple, a dab of butter, and brown sugar in the bottom of the cup, mix the other ingredients in a separate container and pour on top and zap it in the microwave! [It's worth a try~ hmmmmm maybe my hubby might like that some night when I haven't prepared a dessert!]

Then, to plan ahead...on November 14h through January 9th, we'll hang a quilt show of "All That Glitters". I'll be looking for quilts with a whole lot of half-square triangles. You know, the ones that make your eyes wiggle when you look at them. The pattern names that come to mind are Crown of Thorns, Single Wedding Ring, Ocean Waves, Sharyn Craig's Northwind, even a Lone Star sometimes has that eye wiggling effect! I already have four quilt promises, but I'll need six more. Let me know if I can include your quilt!

And after that, I'm thinking about a potpourri theme--where we'll hang quilts by TBQ members who haven't had a chance to share a quilt before. Let me hear from you! ALSO, I'm open to any and all theme suggestions. How about all quilts red/white/black? Talk to me! Tell me what you'd like to see and share...

Quilt sizes needed are:

Large--from 60" to 90" wide, and any length. We need SIX.

Small--at least 45" wide, but no wider than 54". Any length. We need FOUR.

### Quilt Show 2009

Wasn't last month's guest speaker wonderful? TBQ was lucky to have Colleen Wise visit. I wanted to get home and try some shadowing techniques. And with our Community Service Project spelled out, I know most of you were anxious to quilt for that cause, as well. The quilt show committee also wants to remind you that we need QUILTS for display in our 2009 show-- for vignettes, for judging, and for presentation to veterans during the Quilts of Valor segment. So far, four vignette designers have stepped up. We have a need for a few more, so if any of the ideas that Carolyn Edwards presented sounded like fun for you, please call her and volunteer. If you have an idea that wasn't mentioned, we would also welcome that. Again, call Carolyn. Quilts submitted for display need to be quilts that have never been shown in local area guild shows. Vignette quilts may have been displayed before.

The "ugly bucket" was again brimming full when I picked it up after the general meeting. More travel baskets, table runners, placemats and napkins, and wine carriers were added. Thanks again to Susan Gates-Harms, Alice Obrenovich, and Sara Fossett. You are all so talented, generous, and prolific with your donations.

Now a word about Quilts of Valor. A call has gone out to quilters nationwide to submit their quilts to us for presentation on Saturday, during the show. A guild in Florida did a similar project and received 72 guilts. We are hoping for more than that as we have more lead time. Several of you have already asked us about the specifics for a "QOV" so they are as follows:

- 1) Minimum size is 50" x 60" with a maximum size of 72" x 87". Ideal size is 72" x 87".
- 2) Fabrics should be good quality, high thread count, 100% cotton, preferably quilt shop quality and preferably patriotic colors.
- 3) A label that includes the date range, place, name of quilt, name of quilter- with city and state, name of topper-with city and state, a dedication. (Sue's note: I put my e-mail address)
- 4) Presentation case because you wouldn't give a present without wrapping it, (which is basically a pillow case. 5) A journal. This can be a one-page letter about your feelings while you were quilting, a photo journal of the quilting process, or any number of ideas.

For any question about the whole process, visit the Quilts of Valor website. So when you are planning your community quilt, double up the fabric and please sew one for an injured veteran as well.

Now we have one more item for you to consider. If your family makes the \$400 tax credit donation to a school, please consider Prescott High School this year. They have been so gracious to TBQ with assistance in planning the show.
