I know I've told my friends that I only buy fabrics for specific projects; so, I couldn't help wonder why my sewing room is spilling over with fabric. Of course one reason is that I have at least 40 quilts in my head and the fabric is just sitting there patiently waiting for me to get started. I do pet the piles occasionally and get excited for a moment or two when I picture my finished project.



A couple of months ago I decided to work on one of these projects with hopes of getting it finished for the upcoming Quilt Show. This quilt requires 24 shades of blue in lights, mediums and darks and I've been "collecting" my blues for well over a year. Well, after sorting my extensive stash, I actually found that some weren't exactly the right shade and I actually needed to purchase two more mediums. Now, with all the pieces cut (4,225 of them!), I find that my big tub of "blues" doesn't even look like it's been touched! So, if you see a lot of blue fabric at the Company Store in the coming months, you know where it came from!

This story leads me to remind you of three things:

Start working on those quilts you have in your head and get them ready for our Quilt Show--it will be here before you know it!

Clean out your stash and make a donation to the Company Store and don't worry if you don't have any blue fabric to donate!

Be sure to attend our October meeting when our guest speaker, Carolyn Woods, gives us organizing tips for our sewing room. And, no, I will not volunteer to take a picture of my sewing room for her to use as a "before" picture!

THANK YOU! THANK YOU! THANK YOU! for your overwhelming response and taking almost all of the Walker Bag Kits. There will be more kits at our next meeting; so, pick one up. Hopefully EVERYONE will have at least one star by her name, for making a Walker Bag, by July 2013.

We will start making Sensory Quilts too. These are small quilts with 6 rectangles using different textured fabrics for each rectangle. They are used for Alzheimer individuals and people needing hand therapy.

First, we have to collect fabrics with textures – for example – minky, corduroy, burlap, fake fur, flannel, satin, canvas, and chenille. Things like vinyl, terry towels, and old sweaters can be used too.

Cut your texture fabric donations into rectangles 9" x 7" and bring them to the next meeting. They will be collected and regrouped, right at the Community Service table, to make kits. Collect 6 different rectangles and instructions on how to construct these little lap quilts and take one home.

Come by and check out the Sensory Quilt example!

The Activity Director at The Margaret T. Morris Center is so excited about our project. After we meet their needs, we will find other places. Do you have any ideas?
