Since January 16, 2007, there have been 11 different displays hung in the atrium of the Prescott Community Center. Many many thanks to the 52 TBQ members who have shared 110 quilts!! What a grand display it has been...and with more to come!

So that you can be thinking about your next quilts to share (...or maybe you can even get one finished up specifically to hang in these displays...), here are the display dates and themes coming up. Let me know if we can hang yours!

Aug. 29 - Nov. 7: Theme-"Our State Fair"

(Quilts could include anything you would see at the Fair: horses, cows, sheep, chickens, produce, farms, race cars, carousels, circus animals, Ferris wheels. Let's make this a fun one!)

Nov. 7 - Jan. 9: Theme--"All That Glitters"

(We'll be looking for quilts with a whole lot of half-square triangles. You know, the ones that make your eyes wiggle when you look at them. The pattern names that come to mind are Crown of Thorns, Single Wedding Ring, Ocean Waves, Sharyn Craig's Northwind, even a Lone Star sometimes has that eye wiggling going on!)

After that, I'm thinking about a potpourri theme--where we'll hang quilts by TBQ members who haven't had a chance to share a quilt before. Let me hear from you!

Quilt sizes needed are:

Large--from 60" to 90" wide, and any length. We need SIX. Small--at least 45" wide, but no wider than 54". Any length. We need FOUR.

Quilt Show 2009

Looks like a change of venue for the 2009 quilt show. We were fortunate to procur two gyms at Prescott High School, giving us almost 20,000 square feet of display and vendor room. So now we are full steam ahead with the planning. To that end, Carolyn Edwards, the vignette chair, is asking for help. Please see her list of themes below and sign up to help.

If you are starting on potholders, please note that there must be a layer of "Insul-Bright" to ensure heat protection. This can be purchased at Quilters' Dream or Joann's. Insul-Bright packaging says to use one layer of batting in addition to their product.

Since we will be awarding Quilts of Valor on Saturday during the show, the quilt show committee is challenging each of you to make a "QOV." Quilts should be a minimum of 50" x 60" and a maximum of 72" x 87." Fabric should be 100% cotton of good quality (preferably quilt shop).

Your QOV should have a label and a presentation case (pillow case). Complete details can be found at the website: www.qovf.org.
