August 2011 - David Tayler's Floral Pictoral Applique Workshop - 6 hour workshop



This project workshop demonstrates David's hand-appliqué technique using his simple flower pattern of a Colorado columbine flower! Choose to make a realistic flower, or go crazy with fabrics of your choosing. The shape of the columbine makes it ideal for this. The class will also cover his "Yin-yang" hand-appliqué technique. Don't care to hand applique? Bring your fusible web! A purchased pattern is required for all students. The patten may be enlarged to any size!

September 2011 - Anita Shackelford - Anita has been a quilt maker since 1967 and began teaching in 1980. She is an internationally recognized teacher and

lecturer who loves combining appliqué and fine hand quilting to create new quilts in 19th century style. She also enjoys using her sewing machine for many parts of the creative process and has recently added long arm quilting to the mix.





Anita will be teaching her Cherry Wreath. This adaptation of a traditional cherry wreath includes

corded stem, padded fruit, a ruched butterfly, stem stitch and chain stitch embroidery.



TBQ DVD Lending Library Procedure

- 1. TBQ DVD lending library will be open to members before monthly meetings and during break with the exception of July and December luncheons.
 - 2. Members will be able to check out DVDs for the period of one month (two months when checking out in the months of June and November).
 - 3. A late fee of \$1.00 per month per DVD will be charged.
 - 4. A spreadsheet will be maintained listing DVDs by author (or company) and by title so that members can search for specific DVDs. A wait list will be maintained.
- 5. Checkout will be accomplished using a spreadsheet where the member will write their name and phone number. By writing their name TBQ members agree to respect copyright laws.
- 6. Members are encouraged to donate DVDs or donate money towards purchase of DVDs and their names will be noted on the DVD label (e.g. donated by xy).
 - 7. DVDs will be transported to and from meetings be DVD Library committee members.
