President's Message



Have you seen the Downton Abbey fabric Collection "The Women's Collection." I confess I am a Downton Abbey super fan; I've watched this PBS TV series from the beginning. The period costumes are the first things that hold my attention, they are so absolutely beautiful. They were the inspiration for the new fabric collection by Kathy Hall for Andover. Each of the four main aristocratic women's characters have

their collections named after them and reflect their taste and fashion style.

The main character Violet Crawley, the Dowager Countess, is the bold and elegant family matriarch and the fabric named after her are prints and paisleys as large as her presence. The gray, purple and black shades come straight from her wardrobe and the patterns reflect her flair.

Lady Mary is a breathtaking beauty. Mary's fabrics reflect her poise, strength and style with jewel tones in burgundy, blue and green.

Lady Edith is avant-garde in her sense of taste. Edith's collection features fashion-forward colors and designs from the post-Edwardian era, suggestive of the transition toward art deco; this shows in the stylized floral patterns.

Lady Sybil bold geometrics and large florals in her collection reflect Sybil's kindness, cheer and dynamic character. Her colors are dark seafoam and blue gray, as well as mauve and purple.

I am definitely going to be making a Downton Abbey quilt. I have looked at the fabric and find it difficult to make a choice which collection I will go with or how to put together the patterns and colors. The decision is challenging because I know the characters so well having been a fan of the series for so long. I have narrowed my choices down though to either the collection of the Dowager Countess played by Maggie Smith or the beautiful Lady Mary's collection. So go to the fabric store and check this collection out it may inspire you as well.

The auction, taking place in July 2014 will be a lot of fun, thanks to you all – some amazing UFOs have landed in my care and can't wait to be finished.

Aha... this gives me an idea... but I'll speak about it at our March meeting.

Thimbleberries Village: Block of the month project, complete with the 12 blocks, out of which 3 have already been made. Each bag includes the pattern and fabric. Will be auctioned as a whole.

Party with Patrick: 3 small projects:

- For the Birds: $8'' \times 24 \frac{1}{2}$ " banner
- Garden Gal: cover for 14" pillow
- Let them eat cake: 8" snack/mug mat

All three complete with pattern and fabrics. Auctioned separately.

I Spy Quilt top: fit for a single bed 61" x 82 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". The top is finished, all you need is the batting and backing of your choice to make a little boy happy!

Angels: Seven appliqué blocks are at different stage of completion, and there is background fabric for 3 more blocks. Let your inspiration do the rest to assemble the blocks as they are of varied sizes (from 10 3/8" x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " to 10 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 14 $\frac{1}{2}$ "). Comes with fabric, templates and pattern.

Landscape: pretty much done, needs some embellishments and/or finishing touches. Size is $50^{3}/4^{22}$ x 34".

Dresden baskets: another appliqué project where each block measures 12" square. Template, fabric and pattern are included.

Mariner's compass: 3 individual blocks, as is. Maybe for a pillow cover?

I am still looking for more UFO's – the more, the merrier!


