

Thom Atkins has been here before and by popular demand we have him back for our September program and workshop. Thom has been fascinated with beads for over 30 years. He has done bead embroidery, jewelry, and even added beads to some of his bronze

sculptures. His quilting with beads are, for the most part, bead embellished quilts where the beads are embedded in the surface of the quilt and their application does the quilting. Using the quilt as a canvass and the beads as texture and paint, he has developed a unique style combining fabric and beads. Thom's lecture in September will be "My quilts start to Finish."

September Workshop

Thom Atkins - Beaded Bezels and Borders

Thom Atkins workshop on the 15th will be "Beads II Beaded Bezels and Borders." This is a process and technique class. He will have fabric kits for purchase, which will include a fabric sandwich, five bags of seed beads in three sizes (1 bag of 15's, 3 bags of 11's, and one bag of 8's), a bag of bugle beads, a bag of mixed pressed glass beads and heishi, three sizes of needles, and a bobbin of Nymo thread. In short, everything you will need to create a sampler. He will bring an assortment of eight fabrics, with beads and thread to go with that fabric. The only supply list for students is scissors (embroidery), chain nose pliers and pins.
